VALVERDE CASE: THE COURT OF ARBITRATION FOR SPORT (CAS) SUSPENDS THE PROCEDURE

Lausanne, 11 July 2008 – In a decision issued on 10 July 2008, the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) affirmed its jurisdiction to decide the appeals filed by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and the International Cycling Union (UCI) against a decision taken by the Spanish Cycling Federation not to open disciplinary proceedings against the Spanish rider, Alejandro Valverde.

The CAS has, however, suspended the arbitration procedure for a maximum duration of six months in order to allow the Spanish legal authorities to issue a decision on a request for production of evidence (blood bag "no.18") which is currently in its possession. The first - informal - request from the CAS was not accepted by the magistrate in charge of the file. A second request has been sent by the CAS, through official channels, to the competent Spanish authorities. Such procedure of mutual legal assistance can take several months.
